Seeking reconciliation with God and neighbor, let us remember the gift of baptism and confess our sin. *Silence for reflection.*


God of mercy, we confess that we have sinned against you, against one another, and against the earth entrusted to our car.


We are worried and distracted by many things, and we fail to love you above all else.

Forgive us, that we may live in the freedom of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.






Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

Sustain us in your mission until the day you bear us up to join the saints in light. Hear us, O God. **Your mercy is great.**


